VARIETY OF TASKS:

The Operator will report to the Lead Operator and the General Manager and will attend weekly staff meetings. Work consists of water treatment, distribution and sampling including but not limited to the following:

- operates and monitors water treatment plant equipment such as compressors, pumps, filters, chemical feeders, measuring and control valves; disinfection
- assists with maintenance of plant equipment and facilities;
- assists with maintenance of lake water source, shoreline, dam and spillway
- collects water samples for on-site tests and delivery to a regional lab;
- keeps operational records such as plant operator logs, sample results, and maintenance logs
- analyzes data from meters, gauges and SCADA system to coordinate and control flow rate through distribution facilities to meet demand;
- complies with pertinent regulations for drinking water quality
- responds to USA Underground locator requests
- maintains access to plant facilities during winter such as shoveling snow and snowmobiling
- light office work such as voicemail, email, reviewing meeting minutes
- installs, audits, investigates, exercises and repairs water meters and transmitters, street valves, hydrants and mains; even during winter which means locating devices under snow and digging through dirt and snow for access
- communicates effectively; follows oral and written directions; can work cooperatively or solo
- maintains sober capacity for responsibility and respect with co-workers, customers and community

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:
